Message from Kevin

Welcome to the latest edition of our newsletter.

It has been a very busy few months and we are still seeing unprecedented demand for our services. In fact, the 12 months from



April 2022 to March 2023 saw a huge increase in emergency food parcels handed out, with almost 1600 food parcels distributed, an increase of over 100% compared with the prior year. We fed 4700 people, of which around 2,000 were children.

These statistics are extremely concerning. Increasing numbers of people are experiencing financial hardship due to the cost of living crisis and more working people than ever are needing to turn to foodbanks for support. This is not right.

Nationally, foodbanks in the Trussell Trust network saw the highest ever levels of demand, even more than during the peak of the pandemic, as more people found their incomes did not cover the cost of essentials like heating and food. Almost 3 million emergency food parcels were distributed by foodbanks, an increase of 37% compared with the same period last year. More than one million of these parcels were distributed for children.

In December 2022, the Joseph Rowntree Foundation reported that for all low-income households in the bottom 40% of incomes, 7.2 million (62%) were going without essentials. This means that they had reported going hungry or cutting down the size of meals or skipping meals in the last 30 days or going without basics like showers or adequate clothing since June 2022.

Foodbanks are facing their toughest times ever. Please help us ensure we can be there for everyone who needs us.

Referral Agency Liaison Appointment

Foodbanks are, sadly, getting busier and North Cotswold Foodbank is no exception. As a result we have just appointed Sue Dunn to the new role of Referral Agency Liaison. Foodbank vouchers are issued to people by Referral Agencies (statutory and charitable organisations e.g. Citizens Advice or the Job Centre). People can then exchange their voucher for a 3-day emergency food parcel at a local Foodbank. This is a crucial liaison role, supporting and developing the Foodbank's relationship with current and new local referral agencies to enhance the service we offer. It will have a direct effect on identifying people that require emergency food support and enabling North Cotswold Foodbank to provide that support.

Sue started with us at the end of May and is currently working through her induction plan. She will be visiting each of our locations over the next few weeks to meet the teams and explain more about her role. A warm welcome to Sue.

Guarantee our Essentials Campaign

We live in one of the wealthiest countries in the world, but hundreds of thousands of people here in the UK are going without the essentials we all need to get by.

Emergency food parcels distributed by foodbanks in the Trussell Trust network soared to nearly 3 million between April 2022 and March 2023.

Anyone's circumstances can change. Losing your job, needing to care for a sick family member, breaking up with your partner - these are things that can happen to any of us.

Universal Credit should offer support to anyone in need of help, but right now, it's not providing enough to cover the cost of life's essentials. 90% of low-income households receiving Universal Credit are going without at least one essential like food, a warm home or toiletries.

These alarming numbers show that the social security system isn't protecting people from going without. The significant shortfall between people's living costs and the basic rate of Universal Credit is leaving people with no option but to seek support from a foodbank. This simply isn't right.

The Trussell Trust is calling on the UK government to introduce an Essentials Guarantee in our social security system so that, at a minimum, Universal Credit protects people from going without the essentials.

When nearly 3 million emergency food parcels are needed, it's time to Guarantee our Essentials.

Donate food which needs less cooking



More users of foodbanks are now asking for items of food that require minimal or no cooking because they are struggling to afford energy bills. Not using the oven means a few more lights on or hot water. Some families are even choosing cereal as an evening meal because it doesn't need heating up.

Here are five food items that you can donate which need less cooking:

- 1. Instant soups, including Cup-a-Soup and sachet soups
- 2. Tins of cooked meat, including ham and corned beef
- 3. Tinned vegetables, including potatoes, sweetcorn and carrots
- 4. Desserts, including rice pudding and angel delight
- 5. Long-life drinks, including squash and longlife fruit juice
